



### What is a Summons and What is My Duty as a Brother

Albert Mackey, a distinguished Masonic scholar, sheds light on the concept of a Masonic summons, describing it as a formal notice to members regarding the time and place of a lodge meeting. Beyond its practical implications, Mackey underscores the symbolic importance of the summons—a call to unite brethren for Masonic labor and fraternal fellowship.

As a brother, your duty upon receiving a summons is twofold, aligning with Mackey's emphasis on commitment and duty to the craft. First and foremost, it is an obligation to attend all called and stated communications. This not only honors the symbolic call to duty but also demonstrates dedication to the principles and ideals of Freemasonry. Second, a failure to attend or notify the Master of your absence, as discussed by Mackey, may disrupt the cohesive workings of the lodge, potentially diminishing the collective strength of the Masonic community.



In essence, a Masonic summons is both a practical notice and a symbolic call to unite in Masonic endeavors. Your duty as a brother is to actively participate in response to this summons, thereby contributing to the vitality and strength of the lodge. Remember my brother your obligation to respond to all summons sent to and received by you. We look forward to seeing you in lodge.
