

The Book of Constitutions - Cliffs Notes Edition

The very first pages in your presentation volume, and in the methodical digest is the Book of Constitutions. This brief article is a summary of all of Chapter 1. If there's interest, we will summarize subsequent chapters in later trestleboards.

Chapter 1: the Constitution of Masonry, or Ahiman Rezon


In 926, King Athelstane's brother Prince
Edwin obtained a patent from the King for
Masons to regulate themselves, and hold
yearly communications. Prince Edwin was
the first Grand Master. At the first
congregation, they gathered all old writings
and framed these constitutions, and made a
law to preserve and observe the same.
Chapter 1 gives further historical background,

Section 2 - Concerning Government and the Civil Magistrate

Be a lover of quiet and peace, and obey civil powers. The welfare of your country is your duty. Those who "listen to evil councils" are not to be tolerated in their crimes of rebellion against the state. They forfeit all benefits of the Lodge, and fellows would refuse to speak to him. But he is still a mason, and there is hope the rules of the Craft would again prevail with him.

Section 3 - Concerning Private Qualities and Duties

Practice private virtues: be industrious, temperate, and do not reflect dishonor on the Fraternity. This will help the Mason establish command over himself. Providing help & aid to the poor are qualities inherent in the Craft. A Mason is never to shut his ear to those in need, but when a Brother suffers, he is called to open his whole soul in love and compassion, according to his capacity. Abstain from slander and backbiting. Secrecy is required & expected as a virtue.



Section 4 - Concerning the Proposing of New Members in a Lodge

and introduces that the following sections are about the "temper and qualities which are requisite" before enumerating the duties of masons, and how lodges are governed.

Section 1 - Concerning God and Religion

Masons are Sons of Noah, and must believe in God, and cannot be either an unhappy libertine (we might call them hedonists) or a stupid atheist. He shouldn't act against his own conscience. He will shun bigotry and superstition, and use his reason. Rephrasing a well-known line: Masonry is a center of unity and cements friendships among men who otherwise wouldn't ever have met.

Everyone who wants to be a member must be proposed, with an account of the candidate's name, age, quality, title, trade, place of residence, description of his person, and other facts. The proposal must be seconded by some one or more members. Such proposal has to be made in lodge hours, at least one Lodge night before initiation. Make strict inquiry into his character. The candidate should be circumspect too, and has the right before admission to see the warrant or charter of the lodge. Candidates may request a perusal of the bylaws.
